Andrea del Verrocchio (c. 1435-1488) was born in Florence in or about 1435. His father was a tile and brick maker and, later, a tax collector. Verrocchio never married because he had to support his family. He was an Italian sculptor, goldsmith and painter who worked for Lorenzo de Medici in Florence in the early Renaissance. He trained many important painters at his workshop. His pupils included Leonardo da Vinci, Pietro Perugino and Lorenzo di Credi. When one of his students, Leonardo Da Vinci, became better than him, Verrocchio stopped painting. His last work is the magnificent statue of Bartolomeo Colleoni in Venice. He died in Venice in 1488. He is one of the most important Italian sculptors of the Renaissance.
